NJMAA General Meeting Minutes October 3, 2003 East Brunswick Board Offices

Welcome and Introductions

I. Reports

President's Report – John Iatesta welcomed everyone to a new school year. NJMAA has become more active on both the state and now the national level. John requested that everyone should make sure that his or her dues are current. John started of the meeting with update on the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) legislation. There is considerable concern in both music and the general education communities on the long and short-term effects that this legislation will cause. Nick Santoro gave us the latest on the NJDOE Graduation Requirements. 5/5/5 that is 5 credits in fine arts, practical arts and world languages seems to be a done deal. There will be a vote on finalization in January. The Arts assessment is scheduled for 07/08 but the general feeling is that it will not happen.

Treasurer's / Membership Chair's Report - Bob Frampton reported that to date there are18 paid members. The balance in the treasury is \$1082.74. A new Members' Directory will be distributed electronically in Early November.

AANJ News – John Iatesta was invited to speak at the Art Educators Conference that just passed. John also invited AANJ to our April 2 meeting. Rob. McGarry gave out handouts for the emerging artists program.

II. Old Business

Mentoring Initiative Update - Joe Akinskas gave a brief summary on the history of the New Jersey Music Teacher Recruitment and Retention Initiative (NJTRR). He reported that we are into phase II. Last year there were two presentations plus our presence at conventions. This year there is a slightly different format than a regional format. The committee is "taking the show on the road" to the colleges themselves rather than focusing on a regional format. First stop was Rowan University, then TCNJ and MSU. MSU has facilities issues, so that might be problematic. We will present sessions at NJEA that will follow the collegiate luncheon. The NJMEA convention will also contain new teacher training sessions sponsored by NJTRR. Publicity is being handled thorough collegiate chapters as well as targeted e-mails to novice teachers through the efforts of Tom Mosher. There are links on the NJMEA web page. The over all thrust is to give a "nuts and bolts" type presentation with plenty of handouts.
